Dear Chairman Johnson and Ranking Member McCaskill:

We write in support of H.R. 6116, a bill to designate the facility of the United States Postal Service located at 362 North Ross Street in Beaverton, Michigan, as the "Colonel Alfred Asch Post Office." The Beaverton community has voiced their support for bestowing this honor upon Colonel Asch.

Colonel Alfred "Al" Asch was born and raised on a farm in Beaverton, Michigan. In 1941, he joined the United State Army Air Corps 93rd Bomb Group and flew the B-24 Liberator in 28 successful combat missions, including the defeat of Field Marshal Erwin Rommel in North Africa. Colonel Asch returned to Italy and the European Theater with the 455th, flying an additional 42 combat missions over Nazi Germany.

Following WWII, Colonel Asch remained in the Air Force, earning his Command Pilot Wings and was directly involved in the automation of the Air Force in the early 1950s. He was a member of the project team that developed COBOL, a breakthrough computer language. During his military service, Colonel Asch received numerous decorations, earning 13 medals including the Legion of Merit, the Distinguished Flying Cross with the Oak Leaf Clusters, and the Purple Heart. Colonel Asch passed away on December 8, 2013, at the age of 93.
